3,652 New Pupils To Enter Public Schools In Area

With the opening of area schools, officials are faced with the problem of providing space for an additional 3,652 children in the Birmingham, Bloomfield Hills, Southfield and Troy school districts.

A count of all persons between birth and 19 years of age in Birmingham shows an increase of 1,008 new children this year. The biggest increase in the past four years was 1,769 children coming in the area in 1952. In 1953 there were 1,512 new persons.

School officials reported this year there are 4,522 children in the up-to-five age group—2,404 boys and 2,118 girls. This year's young folks from five to 19 years old inclusive number 4,763 boys and 4,392 girls, a total of 9,155.

A NEAR 60 per cent increase was noted in Bloomfield Hills school district where census takers counted 1,675 children this year compared to 1,125 last year.

Students enrolled in Bloomfield Hills school as of June totaled 870. There were 675 in June 1953. Child population of Troy school district has increased from 4,092 in 1953 and 4,699 this year.

Actual student enrollments have increased in Troy schools from 2,235 in 1953 to 2,499 in June 1954. School officials say buildings now under construction will be adequate to handle next fall's load without undue crowding.

CENSUS TAKERS in Southfield district counted 8,741 children this year against 7,854 last year. Actual number enrolled were 3,798 in June 1953 as compared to 4,386 in June 1954.

Southfield schools are growing at the rate of 13 per cent a year, stated Superintendent Glen Schoenhals, and 15 to 18 additional rooms will be needed each year to take care of the increase.

Half day classes may be started this fall for eighth graders in Southfield due to overcrowding of classrooms, school officials said.

School censuses are taken annually to make a more equitable determination of each school district's share of sales tax diversion and primary monies.

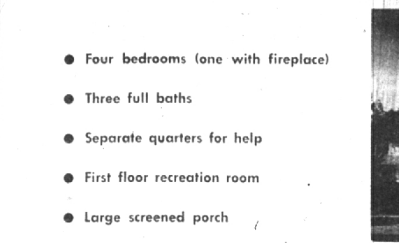

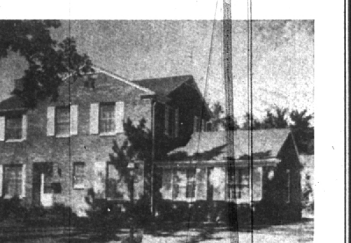
