

City, Rec. Board Press for Shelter

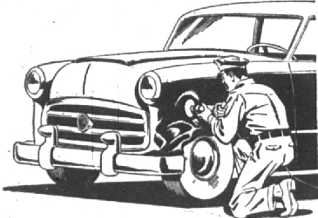

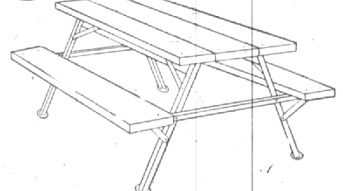
George Souter Household Humming with Activities

Society deadline is 3 p.m. each Tuesday.

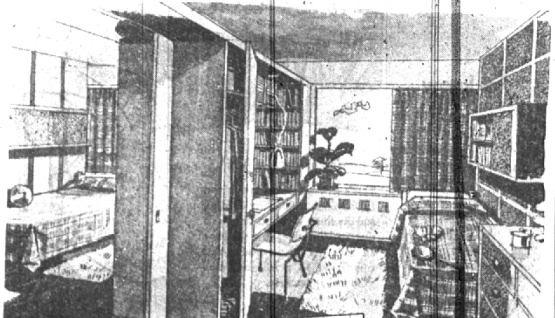
