State Church Group Helps German Youth Attend Area School

Under the sponsorship of the Department of State and the Michigan Council of Churches, Hanns-Jurgen Kristen is spending a year in Michigan in the annual foreign student program.

The youth will stay with Mr. and Mrs. William Vincent, 1345 S. Bates, and will be enrolled in Southfield high school.

Hanns is the son of Dr. Kristen and Annemie Genter, both dental surgeons in Bremen.

He was born in Berlin, but has spent the greater part of his life in Bremen where he attended school.

Although he has only been in this country since July 28, Hanns has already formed several definite ideas about this country. One is that the American people as a whole are much friendlier than those in Germany.

"When you talk to people here, like in the shops, they are much kinder than they are at home," Hanns remarked. "Shops here, he describes as 'less specialized' than in his native country, where a meat market sells only meats, a green grocer only fruits and vegetables, and so on. 'Maybe in the big cities they have the supermarkets, but not in small cities and towns,' he explained.

Hanns, he said, are quite similar to ours, but do not have as many modern improvements, especially our deep freezer. "In Bremen we have to shop real often because we do not have

fruits are bought fresh and used quickly."

En route to Birmingham, he was in New York City only a little over two hours, but saw enough there and in other metropolitan areas to decide American buildings are much higher than in Germany.

HE WILL spend a year in high school here, return to Germany to complete that phase of education and then hopes to enroll in the university to study engineering.

"The high school, in Germany," he said, "is quite different from what it is here."

"An entrance examination is required and high school is attended only by those boys and girls who intend to go on to a university or college."

"One is compelled to attend school only to the age of fourteen. Those who have no intention of attending college go right to work."

The idea of working part time is something new to Hanns, something he had never heard of before. "At home, to get pocket money the older boys and girls usually tutor younger ones. Mowing lawns and things like that are not done, unless parents pay their children

for doing the work around the house."

His studies in Germany include English, French, chemistry, physics, history, drawing, math and "a few smaller subjects."

MATH, HE ADMITS, may be the stumbling block in his future as an engineer.

He is eagerly awaiting the opening of the fall sports season, since football is not played in Germany.

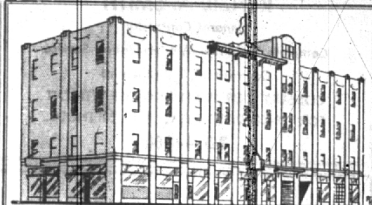
His sports include tennis, track and some swimming. He has also played some soccer.

The fall, good looking youth said that he is looking forward to returning to this country for further study.

He would like to complete his high school training at home, attend the university for a year or two, and then come back to the United States to complete his education.

His immediate future includes attending the session which starts Aug. 29 at Camp Talahi, the Congregational church, near Brighton.

"When I return from there it will be time for school," Hanns smiled. "I am very anxious for school and to meet more American people."

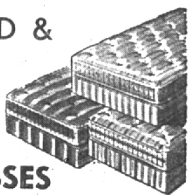

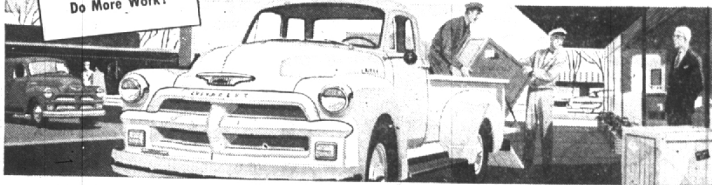

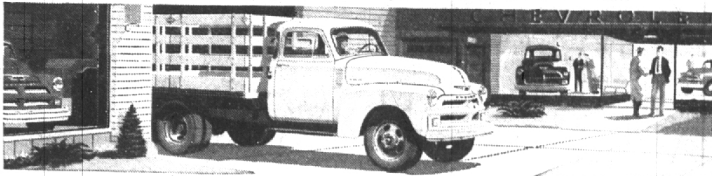
