

Cranbrook Work Nears Completion

Construction of a unique apartment building going on at Cranbrook school as maintenance men prepare for a peak fall enrollment.

The new faculty apartment joins Stevens Hall dormitory at the second floor level and then extends out over a much-used walk which leads to the school's quadrangle. Although the apartment appears to derive support from sky hooks, five large concrete posts, flanking the walk way, offer firm foundation.

Other construction is in process to make way for a new school bus. The driveways have been blacktopped, the gate posts set further apart, and the garage door enlarged.

The school's gymnasium has a new look with the installation of additional lockers for students, an enlarged wrestling area, and a new coat of special insulating paint.

Speeding Charge Puzzles Court

A Birmingham man was confronted with his fourth speeding violation and the possibility of forfeiting his driver's license for a six months period to state police (which is the usual procedure on a fourth speeding violation) when he appeared in Justice Court Friday, Aug. 20.

Donald Walter Nancarrow, 33, of 1265 Wakefield, was ticketed on the basis of a radar meter, July 22 for speeding 42 miles an hour in a 25 mile zone on Adams road.

His counsel, a Detroit attorney, maintained in court that they were to derive support from sky hooks of the radar machine. But the complainant to a misdemeanor should be an eye-witness, he declared.

"Here a machine was the only eye-witness and radar machine can't sign a complaint."

THE RADAR machine does not identify the driver, reasoned the counsel, only the car. "And we are not for one minute contending that this man was the driver."

Continued the counsel: "Arresting officer Richard E. Brown signed a complaint based on the reading of a machine."

"The car is ticketed in an over-parking violation. But the person is ticketed on a speeding violation," the counsel maintained.

Birmingham Justice John J. Emery Jr., agreed the counsel should proceed on the basis of the subject to proof. The case was set for September 10.

To Attend Meeting

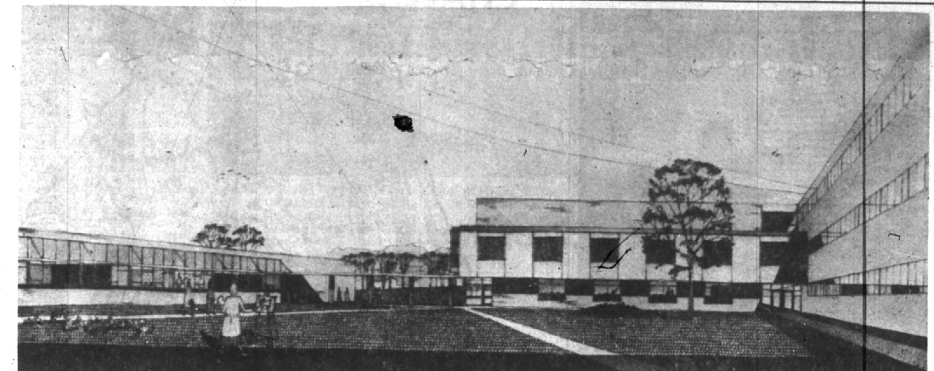

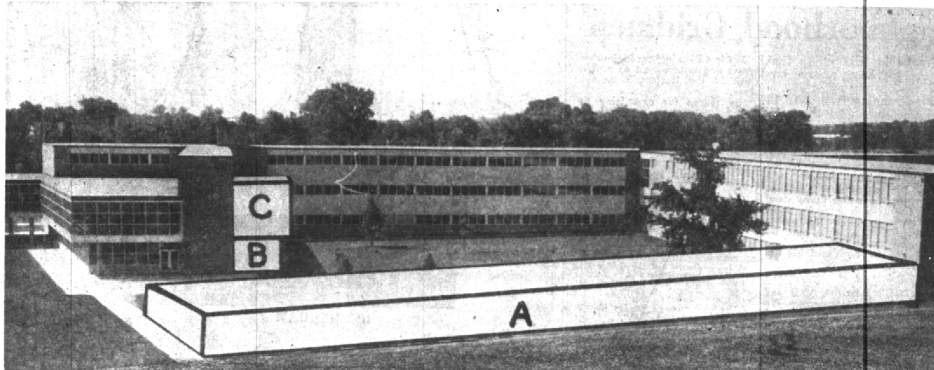

At the left in the architect's sketch of the Birmingham high school is the new eight classroom section and study hall extending east and west and joining the main structure of the northern part of the three-story wing along Cranbrook. At the center is the first floor extension

of the cafeteria, above which will go a new study hall. Contractors started work August 19. Completion is promised by February 1, mid-semester, with the provision that no strikes occur in the meantime.



The proposed additions to the Birmingham high school are shown in relationship to the main building. The picture is looking southwest over the inner courtyard. Addition A will have eight classrooms and a study hall. This section joins the northern part of the three-story wing along Cranbrook. The extension to the cafeteria is B. Section C will be the new study hall. Both B and C are attached to the library

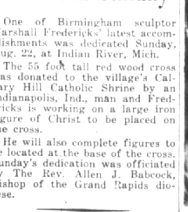
