(Continued from Page One) Reid, unopposed, gained 2400 votes for the Republican nomination as lieutenant governor and Ferguson, also unopposed, was given 2746 Republican votes in the U. S. Senator race.

REPUBLICAN U. S. Representative George Hendon polled 2571 votes in his unopposed bid for reelection. In the state senate contest on the Republican side, Bloomfield received 1534 votes to 516 for Howard K. Kelley, his closest opponent. VanDusen claimed nearly 1400 votes in the Republican bid for the third district's state representative post with 2665 ballots to 181 for Wallace R. Furber.

All county incumbents, with the exception of Sheriff Clare Hubbell, were given wide margins towards nomination for reelection in the Republican party.

HUBBELL also offered a setback both on the local and county level, was defeated by Berkeley Ford, Chief Frank Franks here by a 1282 to 1125 margin.

Other Republican county officials who were re-elected include Clerk Lynn D. Allen, 2584; Prosecutor Frederick C. Ziem, 2507; Treasurer Charles A. Sparks, 2635; Register of Deeds Orrin McQuaid, 2621; Drain Commissioner Ralph A. Main, 2724; and Surveyor Omar E. McNutt, 2554.

Locally, successful Democratic nominees for county posts were Robert L. O'Connell, 176 votes for prosecuting attorney; George D. Hicks, 201 for sheriff; Neil E. Crowe, 296 for clerk; Donald E. Barrett, 202 for treasurer; Hazel A. Kaschinsky, 285 for register of deeds; and Glenn B. Harper, 293 for drain commissioner.

The Democrats offered a candidate for the county surveyor's post, but the organization failed to pick one.
