Woodward-8 Mile Separation Work Contract Awarded

The Darin and Armstrong construction company of Detroit was awarded the contract for the Woodward-Eight Mile road grade separation this week by the Michigan State Highway department.

Cost of the major structure was set at \$3,386,000 and completion date is December 15, 1955.

It will be a tri-level structure with the ground level used for turning, Woodward crossing on the second level. It will also include three service drives.
