Act to Conserve City Water Supply

LATHRUP — Two amendments to the city's water ordinance were approved by city councilmen Monday night in an attempt to preserve the city's water supply.
 One amendment contains regulations for the use of fire hydrants in the city while the second change restricts taps into water lines to a one-inch diameter.
 The latter regulation was considered emergency legislation and takes effect immediately.

New City Attorney

LATHRUP—James K. O'Leary, 28079 Eldorado, was named city attorney by council members Monday night. The council, at the same time, accepted the resignation of former City Attorney William Ewart and instructed City Clerk Florence Bennett to write a letter of appreciation to Ewart.

Amend Ordinance

LATHRUP—An amendment to the city's building ordinance to regulate size of chimney flues when also used for incinerator flues was approved at its first reading by city councilmen Monday night. The amendment was recommended by the city's new building inspector, A. F. Hunt.

TROY—A fine of \$25 for being drunk and disorderly was paid by Matthews W. Bales, 31, Berkley. Bales was fined by Judge Scott Ryea Saturday night.

Township Looked Like Thieves' Hive Over Weekend

BLOOMFIELD — One holdup, three burglaries, a stolen automobile and the theft of building materials within the last several days were attributed to different culprits by Police Chief Clark Green Monday.
 The holdup occurred Sunday about 2 a.m. at Rochette Bros. Service station, Woodward and Square Lakes, when three young men believed to be in their twenties removed \$277 in cash while holding Robert Sprout, attendant, at gunpoint.

The home of Dr. B. E. Carl, 1424 Inwood Circle, was ransacked Thursday night and not more than \$10 was taken. Mrs. Carl's auto was stolen from the garage and discovered abandoned five hours later in a sub-division near Hickory Grove and Franklin.

Friday morning a service station at 1947 S. Telegraph was broken into and ransacked, but the owner reported nothing missing.

Also Friday, Robinson Bros. reported building supplies missing from a subdivision at Adams and Wattles.

Add Funds to Fire Protection Service

LATHRUP — In preparing to sign a fire protection contract with Southfield township, city councilmen Monday night instructed City Administrator Leonard Watchowski to draw \$1,848.45 from the contingent fund to make up a difference in the year's fire protection appropriation.
 Lathrup's budget originally called for \$16,500 for fire services, but the township contract asks \$18,348.

30 Auto Accidents Recorded in July

Thirty auto accidents resulting in seven personal injuries and the year's second fatality occurred during July, the monthly accident summary prepared by the Birmingham Police Department reveals.

According to Police Chief Ralph W. Moxey, the July accident toll was higher than the 26 accidents recorded for this month last year. However, estimated property damage was less—\$6,350 this year compared to \$9,928 for the month last year.

The second fatal accident of the year occurred when a motorcycle was following a car too closely and ran into the back of the car when it slowed for a red traffic signal.

RIGHT OF WAY violations again led the list of violations, with 11 recorded for the month. Fifty-five accidents this year have been caused by right-of-way violations.

The driver should use care and caution at all times when pulling into streams of traffic, Moxey stated.
 In the Chief's opinion, past accident summaries bear out the statement that "Accidents are caused—they don't just happen."

All property within the city will be re-assessed by the time rolls are prepared next year, city officials hope.

Confirm Roll

LATHRUP — City councilmen Monday night confirmed a special assessment roll totaling \$3,650.08 for black-topping of E. California from Sunset to Tolerence. The council set three annual payments to finance the improvement.

Car Allowance

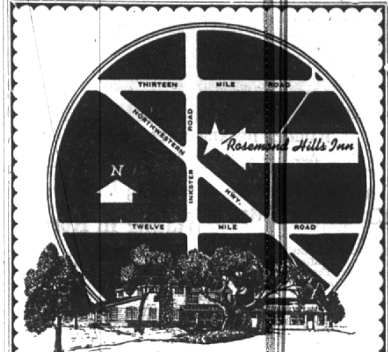
