Amateur performances have included Father Loni's "Light Up the Land" and "Brigadoon." He also appeared on Arlene Frances' television program in June.

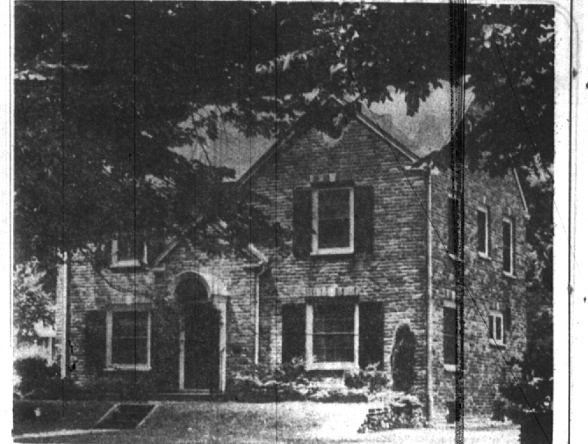
The son of Mr. and Mrs. Ted Carlisle of Birmingham, Bruce was graduated from Birmingham high school in June, 1953.

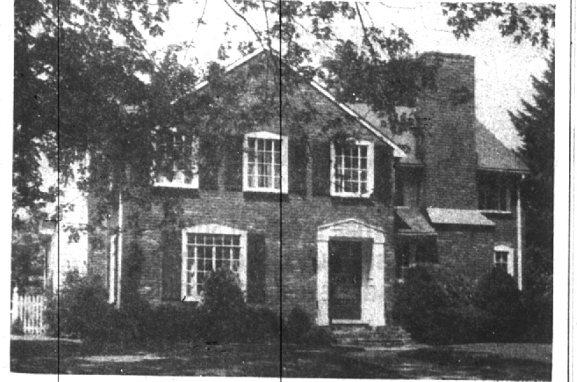

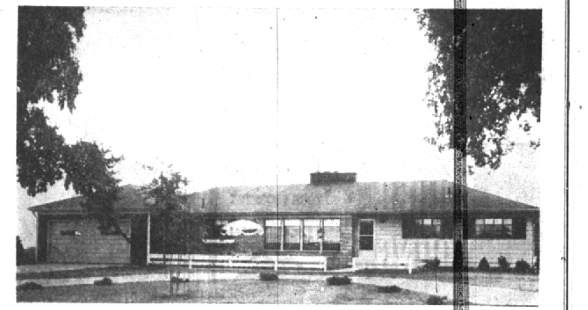
