In view of the Supreme Court decision against segregation in the public schools of the country, members of the Oakland county branch, Women's International League for Peace and Freedom, held a symposium on the Universal Declaration of Human Rights at its regular monthly meeting Tuesday, Dec. 16.

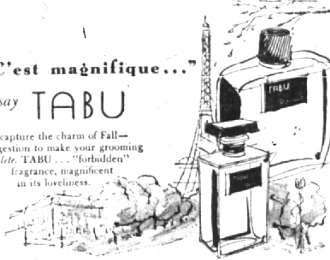

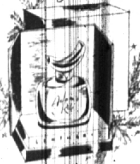
