The Civil Air Patrol is flying high these days with a new plane, an L-16 built by the US Air Force. In a regional conference of five local states, the Air Force decided that the Birmingham squadron has more flying time than any other group of flyers. As a reward for its hard work and ability, CAP received the new plane, which is more reliable than the L-4.

Both planes are modeled for defense and rescue work, the L-16 having higher speed, a more powerful engine with a cruising speed of 88 mph and fuel for two hours and 35 minutes. The L-16 can be flown by any qualified CAP pilot. Among the pilots to be air-borne are Bill Heymer, Ruth Hibbard, Joyce Kepler, Mike Kinkiner, Bob Minge and Jay Simons.

Future Christmas Program's Theme

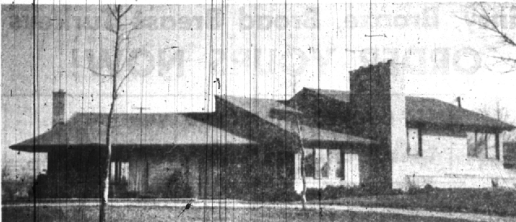
