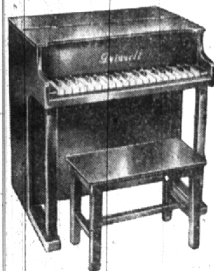

Rezoning Hearing Planned Dec. 14

An informal public hearing on a request to rezone a section of land adjoining Lincoln and Southfield will be held Dec. 14, Birmingham Plan Board Chairman James Spurr announced.

The owner of the property, Mary G. Latham, has asked that present zoning requirements, which call for single family occupancy, be changed to allow construction of income bungalows. A similar request, to change the zoning to permit multiple housing, was heard by the board in June, and was denied at that time.

Of this amount, the Birmingham school district will gain \$1,255,808.61 with \$319,159.66 going to the county.

Bills are payable December 10 through January 19. After the January deadline a four percent penalty will be added.

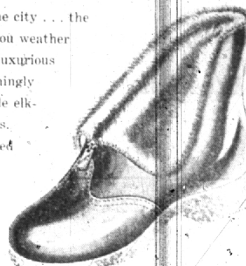

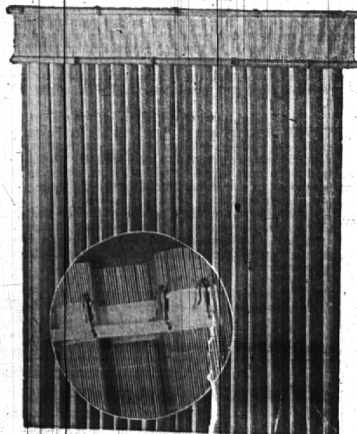
