The present-projected gym, and use the same locker room facilities. The auditorium can be erected at the rear of the maud section.
Use of an increasingly popular type of cast concrete arch suspension in the gym roof is designed to provide strength while keeping costs to a minimum.
This type of arch has been used extensively in Europe and in South American construction, but the new school will have the first of its type in this country.
THE FIRST floor will house special purpose rooms, such as the cafeteria, laboratories, and school offices.
On the second floor will be 24 classrooms, plus a large library. All rooms will have windows to both the inner court and the exterior of the hollow-square shaped building. The facade will be stone, with coloring and architectural details still to be determined. The heating system will use oil, with hot-water radiators.
No name for the school has as yet been considered or approved by the board of education.
