The Rev. Robert D. Dewey preaches the second in the Advent sermons, with his topic being

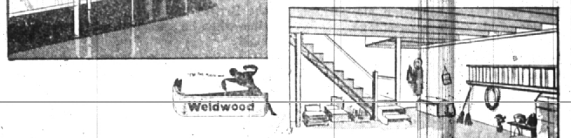
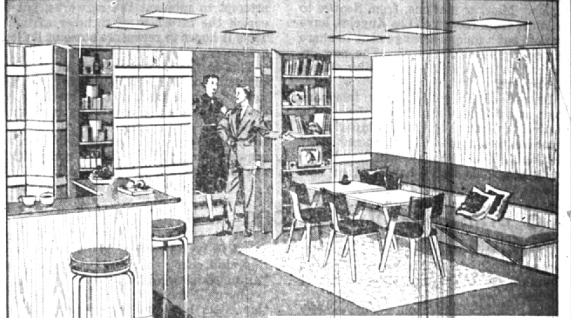
