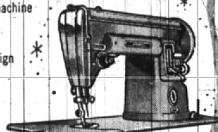

Former Resident Announces Dec. 7 Detroit Concert

A former resident of Birmingham, now of Detroit, Evelyn Scheyer will be presented in a piano recital on Dec. 7 at 8:00 p.m. in the Detroit Institute of Arts lecture hall.

She will include some of the works of Bach, Beethoven, Brahms, Chopin, Frit, Lobos and Albeniz.

A native of Holland, she began playing the piano at the age of five. She studied at the Franz Liszt school and later was tutored by Lili Kraus, both in Amsterdam, giving her first recital five years later.

SHE PLAYED extensively in Europe, including radio work in her homeland, before her marriage to Dr. Ernst Scheyer in 1935, and ultimate move to this country.

In this area she became known for her ability as a pianist and was an active member in the Birmingham Musicales.

With her husband, a professor of art history and the humanities at Wayne, and their two daughters, Mrs. Scheyer arranges many home programs of chamber music. Local ticket sales are being handled at the Little Galleries on East Maple.

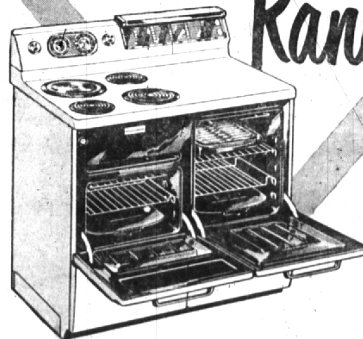

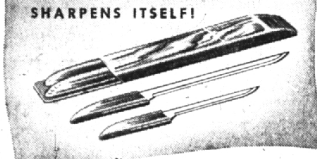
