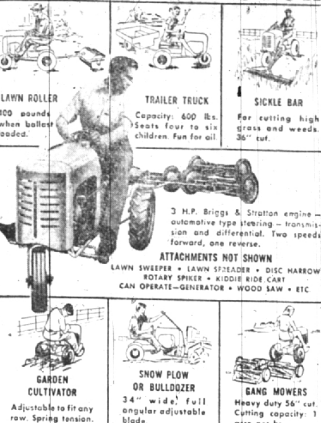
The next regular meeting of the trustees will be held on the third Monday in May unless there are applications filed for loans. In case
