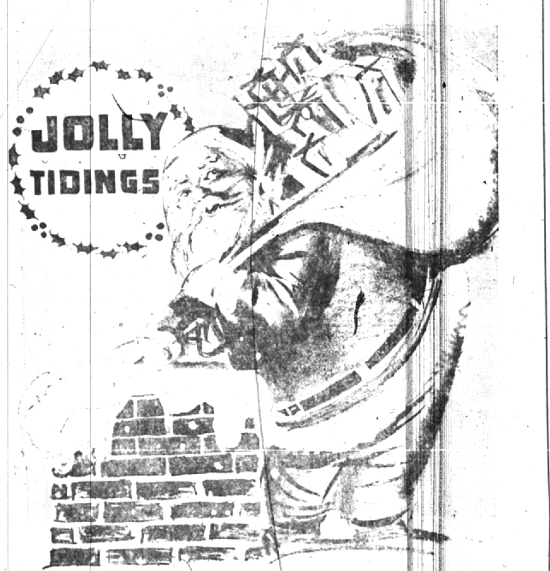
MSC Juniors Tell Troth
