The winning varsity affirmative team was composed of Sue Spencer and Fred Shinnick while the losing negative team consisted of Dick Silbar and Joe Kroeger.

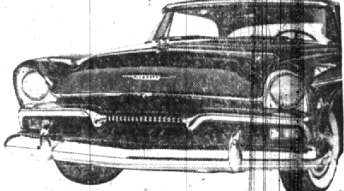
