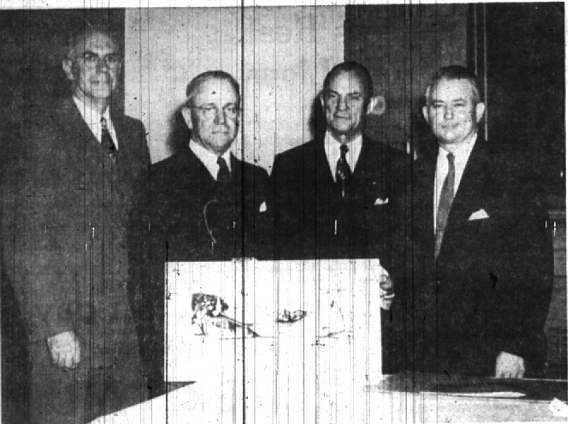
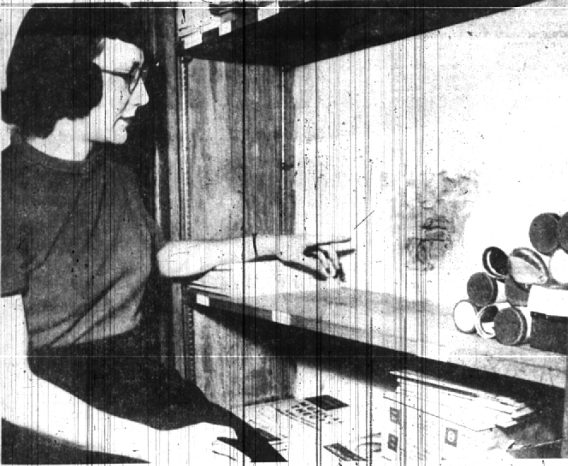


# Chronology for 1954

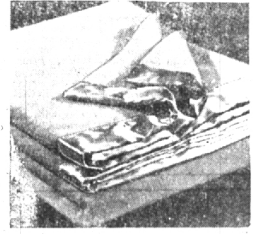
