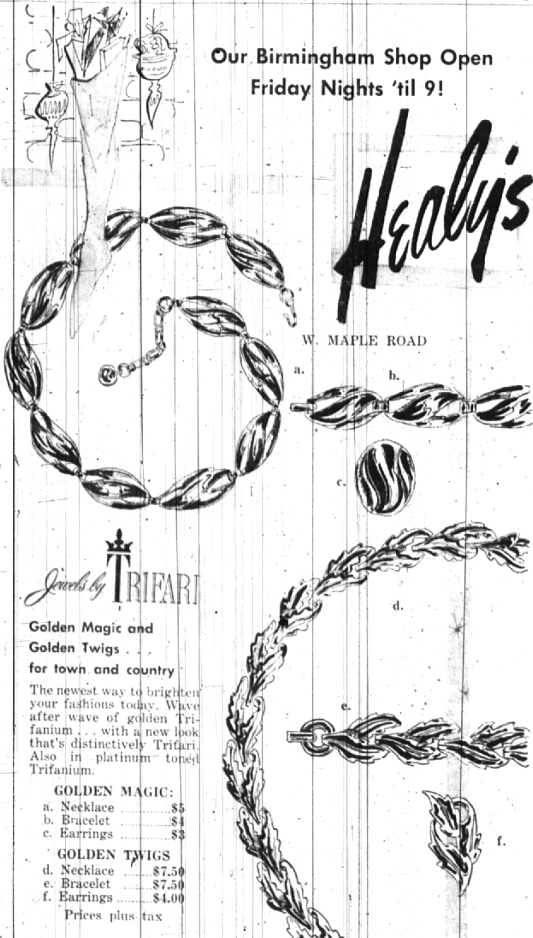
and Mrs. Alvin Munroe, and Mrs. William McCurdy. Refreshments were served during the evening.
