A total of 52,395,200 gallons of water was pumped from Birmingham wells during November; the bureau of water supply reported.


Top day for the month was the 24th, when 2,354,000 gallons were consumed. The Wakefield well produced 22,670,000 gallons, the most of the city's eight wells.




