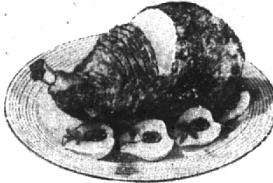

Lawbreakers Pay Most of Way Thru Local Courts

"Ten dollars fine, and ten dollars cost."

This phrase, often spoken by judges in assessing penalties on persons breaking the law, sometimes causes confusion and misunderstanding on the part of the person to whom it is addressed.

In general, people understand the fine well enough, but in many cases they do not know what is meant by costs.

This misunderstanding has given rise to the false belief that judges pocket that part of a penalty called cost.

Birmingham Justice John J. Gailli and Troy Township Justice Herbert Alden explain that these costs are simply added to fines to defray the court's expense in handling cases.

BEFORE a case comes to court, certain papers must be prepared, witnesses are set subpoenaed, and juries frequently impaneled. All this involves expense to the court.

Thus, when a person is found guilty of breaking a law, he not only has to pay a fine but also must reimburse the court for at least part of the cost involved in handling his case.

Birmingham City Clerk Miss Irene Hanley, who also is clerk of Birmingham justice courts, points out that in cases involving violations of city ordinances, the total amount of the costs assessed goes into the city's general fund.

COSTS APPLIED in cases involving state laws are forwarded to the county treasurer. A portion of these costs are rebated to the city to defray its expense in handling the case. Miss Hanley said the average rebate amounts to about \$4.90.

Financed in cases concerned with city laws go into the city general fund. Those involving cases prosecuted by the state go to the state (county library fund under order of the state legislature.

Judge Alden said all fines levied by his court go into this fund. Court costs assessed against violators are turned over entirely to the county treasurer and then are used to help finance county and township law enforcement agencies.

NO PART of fines or cost assessed is pocketed directly by the courts.

Methods for payment of judges for their services are different in cities than in townships. Judge Gailli receives a yearly salary from the city. On the other hand, Judge Alden is paid under a system of scheduled fees set up by the state.

These fees vary slightly with the nature of the case handled, but the average is \$2. Judge Alden said. Fees are paid to the court by the county treasurer at the close of each month.

JUDGE ALDEN estimates that his pay as a judge amounts to about \$1 per hour.

Judges are allowed to keep money collected for performing marriage ceremonies.

The men said they took the car to get them to a trailer camp near Lake Orion where they were staying, detectives reported. They said they were out of money and had used most of the way from Detroit where they had been making the rounds of employment offices.

Arraigned before Judge John J. Gailli in Birmingham justice court Wednesday, they were bound over to circuit court.
