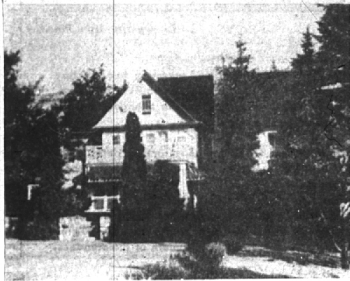


100 YEARS AGO

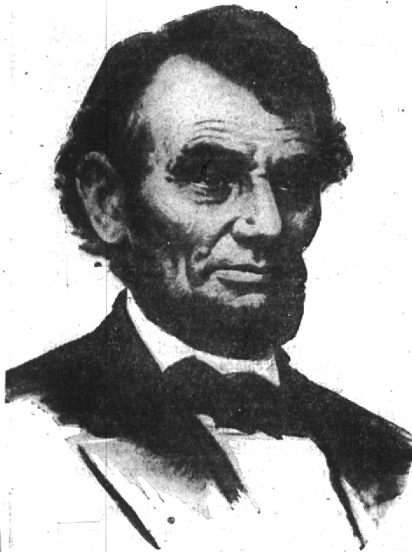

Observing this holiday, our offices will not be open Friday the 12th of February.

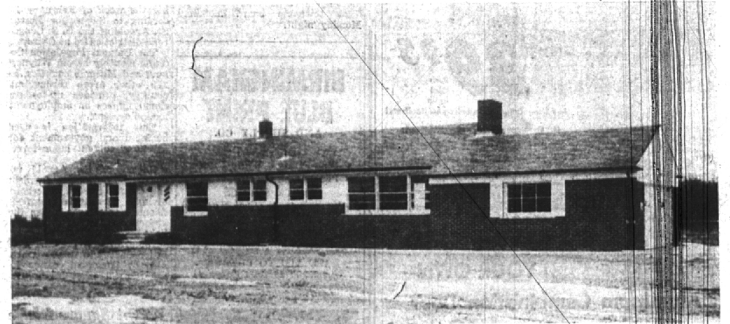
