

Will Explain Aims of Group Backing Bingo

The Charitable Bingo and Raffle Assn. of Oakland County will hold its next regular weekly meeting on Thursday, Feb. 11, at 8:00 p.m., at the Knights of Pythias Hall, 962 Voorheis road, Pontiac.

All charitable non-profit organizations in Birmingham and vicinity are invited to have representatives at this meeting so that purposes and program of the association can be fully explained, and so that blank petitions can be furnished to enable the voters to have the opportunity of expressing their opinion on the authorization of lotteries conducted by charitable non-profit organizations in Michigan.

This association is composed of 20 civic, fraternal, veterans and other charitable non-profit groups of Oakland county whose purpose is to circulate petitions to amend Section 33 of Article V of the Constitution of the State of Michigan to permit the state legislature to authorize lotteries by non-profit charitable organizations; subject to statutory limitations.

OVER 2,000 petitions have now been distributed to member groups, and at each weekly meeting completed petitions are being turned in to the county organization. The completed petitions are forwarded to the Michigan Association of Non-Profit Charitable Organizations, Lansing, which is composed of two representatives from each of the 11 county organizations now working on the petition circulation.

Accused of cashing forged checks totaling nearly \$300, Mrs. Winnifred Louise Moore, 356 Howard McNeill, Pontiac, was bound over for trial in circuit court at her arraignment Friday in Birmingham justice court.

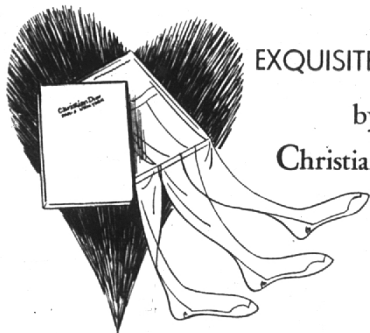
