

Young People's Concert Series Ends March 6

Basil Rathbone, international star of stage, screen, radio and TV, will be featured as narrator in Prokofiev's "Peter and the Wolf" at the fourth and final young people's concert by the Detroit Symphony Orchestra on Saturday morning, March 6 at 11 in the Masonic Auditorium.

Valere Poole will conduct and Lauretine Collins will tell the story of the programmed works. The theme for the final program in "The World of Music" series will be "Orchestra with Soloists." Dorothy Pixley, winner of the young people's contest, will be presented as piano soloist, playing Mendelssohn's "Cello Concerto in B-flat." Beethoven's "Overture to Fidelio" will open the program.

FRESH FROM his recent success on TV in James Thurber's "The Thirteen Clocks," Rathbone will demonstrate his versatility as narrator with orchestras. His narrator appearances include performances of "Peter and the Wolf" and Schumann's "Manfred" with the San Francisco and Boston orchestras as well as "The Nigamingle and the Rose" with the Philadelphia orchestra.

Piano soloist at Saturday's concert, Dorothy Pixley, 16, is winner of the recent city-wide Young People's contest. She is also an accomplished performer on the violin, flute and harp. Her piano teacher, Margaret Mansbach, is a former member of the Detroit Symphony orchestra.
