14 Mile Opening Receives Backing Of 437 Residents

Birmingham city commissioners will not be alone in their determination to have 14 Mile road opened between Southside and Cranbrook roads.
Support from 437 persons—all but a few from the south-western portion of the city near where the road opening would be—appeared Monday night in the form of signatures on a petition endorsing the city's stand.

OPPOSITION appeared in December from the 14 Mile Committee, composed of residents in that area who charged that opening of this stretch of highway is not required by traffic volumes, would require adjoining residential values, and the project would be too expensive.
In commenting on the controversy, Mayor Ralph A. Main said at Monday night's meeting: "A survey now is under way by the state and Detroit regarding traffic volumes and flows in this north metropolitan region. The survey should help tell us some of the things we might need to know about traffic in this area."
