Schools Plot Attendance Areas In Face of Growing Enrollments

"Forty more teachers . . . crowded classes despite 48 additional rooms . . . need for two more junior high schools in the future . . . twenty new classrooms needed at the high school, as soon as possible."

These are problems faced by the Birmingham board of education as it studies ways and means of juggling enrollments to accommodate the district's present student population of 7,000 when classes convene next fall.

At a special board meeting Monday night, members of the school district's administrative staff outlined recommendations for next fall's use of schools in the Adams, Quorton, Walnut Lake, and Franklin areas.
