**Dean to Give Educational Talk For AAUW Groups**

February 10 will mark the Area Invitation luncheon meeting of Birmingham's American Association of University Women. At 12:45 p.m., members from nine branch groups of AAUW in Detroit, Pontiac and adjoining communities will meet to hear Nancy Duke Lewis, Dean of Pembroke College at Brown University, speak on "Freedom and Authority in Education" at the Birmingham Community House. Mrs. Howard B. Green, education chairman, will introduce the guest speaker, Miss Lewis, who has been Dean at Pembroke since 1950, received both her A.B. and master's degrees from the University of Kentucky. In addition, she did post-graduate work at Syracuse University. Prior to her arrival at Pembroke, Miss Lewis was counselor in academic advising at the woman's college of the University of North Carolina for six years. In 1943, she came to Pembroke and less than a year later became assistant to Dean Margaret Shove Morris. Miss Lewis succeeded Dean Morris upon her retirement.

In 1919, Miss Lewis was given the first travel grant ever received by a woman by the Carnegie Corporation of New York. The grant made it possible for her to visit more than 20 colleges and universities of various types and to study their administrative and academic organization.

Nancy Duke Lewis is a member of Phi Beta Kappa, National Association of the Deans of Women, she is acting secretary of the American Conference of Academic Deans and is chairman of the National Education committee of the American Association of University Women.

Following the program, tea will be served in the Ruth Shain room of the Community House. Mrs. Neil E. Warren, president of the Michigan state division of AAUW will be there. 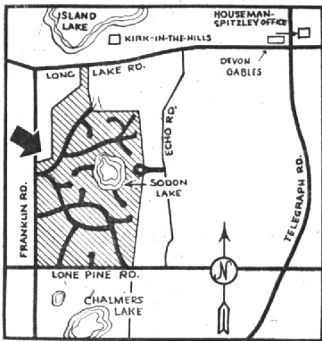

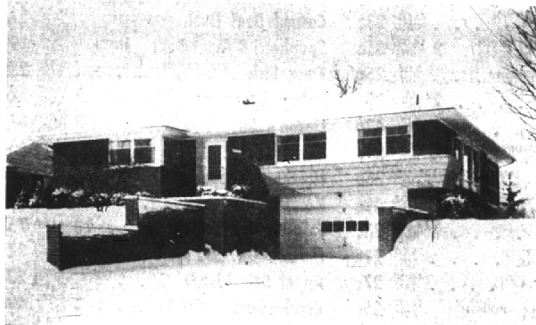

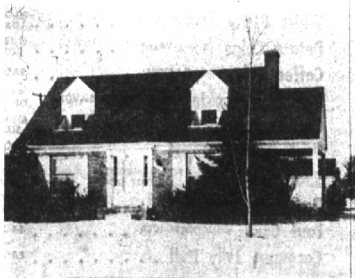
