**UH&WF Costs Only 6% To Operate**  
Cost of operating the United Health and Welfare Fund of Michigan in the past year has been 6 per cent, according to a report by W. D. McIntyre, president of the state fund. The report, summarizing the December meeting of the UH&WF's Executive Committee,

for the 26 state and national agencies financed through the UH&WF. This will bring to approximately two and a quarter million dollars the total raised in Michigan for these agencies which include Heart, Arthritis, Cerebral Palsy, Multiple Sclerosis, Sister Kenny and Leader Dog. Beginning Jan. 1, the Michigan League for Nursing will receive

financial support from the UH&WF, according to the McIntyre report. A merger of two nursing organizations, this agency works to improve nursing service and nursing education throughout the state. It will seek full inclusion in the UH&WF when the Admissions and Budget Committee for the state fund meets in May.

Other matters discussed at the executive committee meeting included a request of the United Cerebral Palsy Assn. for additional funds to meet increasing needs of its service programs in the state and the probabilities of Michigan financing a complete USO Camp Shows unit.

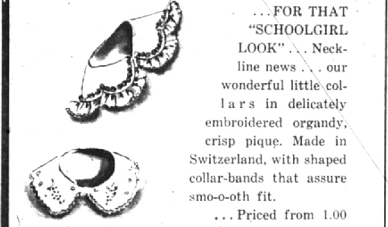
