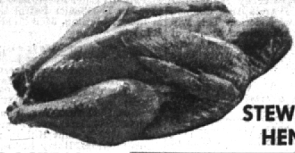

## American Lutheran Church Organizing

## Mich. Bell Taxes Swell School Fund

The Michigan Bell Telephone Company again last year was the largest single contributor to the state Primary School Fund with a payment totaling \$7,086,904.

According to figures released this week by A. H. Warner, manager here for Michigan Bell, \$90,615 of the total was allocated to the public school system of Birmingham. School's throughout Oakland County, including the city of Birmingham, received a total of \$616,976 from the company's tax payment.

Warner said the payments were based on a school census of 6,842 in Birmingham and 115,914 in Oakland County, as compiled by the State Department of Public Instruction.

The company's tax payment last year amounted to \$4.46 for each of the 1,589,923 youngsters in the state between the ages of 5 and 19 who are on the census rolls.

Michigan Bell, in common with railroads, Pullman, railway express, telegraph, and other telephone companies, pays a state property tax earmarked for the Primary Fund in lieu of other property taxes.

## Democratic Candidate Addresses Local Club

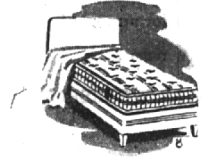
