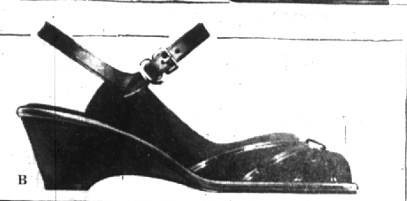

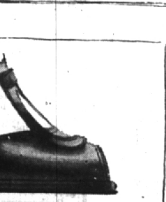

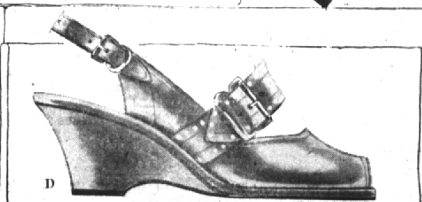
A. The black pump in whisper-soft suede, 9.95



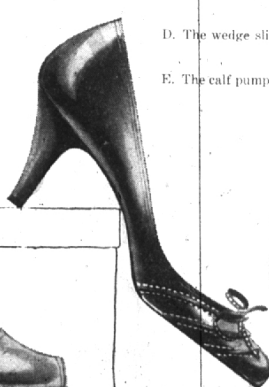
B. The wedge sandal in navy suede and calf, 9.95.
