

Institute Films Feature North

Two outstanding documentary films on the far north will be shown to members of Cranbrook Institute of Science at 8:15 p.m., Jan. 22, in Cranbrook School Auditorium.

A full-length film with much of the action taking place in Lapland, "The Valley of the Eagles" shows herds of reindeer, the Lap's use of the eagle in hunting, and other customs of these people as the camera follows a chase through wild north country.

The second film on the program, "The Alaskan Eskimo," is the first in a new Walt Disney series entitled "People and Places." It shows Kogamak and his family building houses, using the kayak, preparing food, sledging, carving ivory, and relaxing with games and dances.

Although seating facilities limit the showing of these films, part of a yearly series, to members of Cranbrook Institute of Science, annual membership is open to the public for as little as \$5 for adults and \$2 for children.

Save Pennies And Destroy Your Home!

The process for dry cleaning a garment or fabrics in the home is one of the most dangerous jobs that can be attempted. Liquid materials required for this operation, have in some cases, the lowest flash points possible for petroleum products. THE PERSON using this material is never conscious of this density until ignition from a stove, match, light switch or some other source has touched it off. The results are always serious burns, or death, to the operator and other occupants of the home, plus heavy damage to the building.

Recently, approved non-inflammable liquids have appeared on the market. The label on their container indicates whether or not the material is safe for home cleaning.

If you must do home cleaning, for what few pennies are saved, use this type material and read the label thoroughly.

Remember to play it safe! The lives of members of a family are worth more than the chances you take when doing home cleaning with naphtha, gasoline or other highly inflammable liquids.

Bloomfield Hills Dog License Trade Termed 'Very Slow'

Applications for dog licenses in the City of Bloomfield Hills have been coming in at a slower than usual rate, according to Robert Stadler, city clerk.

Stadler said last week that all dogs must have inoculations

against rabies before a license can be issued. This is the first year that such a requirement has been in effect in the city, and, according to Stadler, many dog owners are making applications for licenses without presenting proof that such inoculation have been given. Stadler said a certificate will be given by a veterinarian at the time of inoculation. He warned that after March 1, residents will have to pay a penalty to secure a license.
