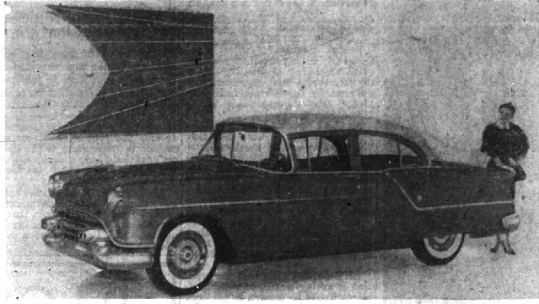

Southfield Sets 3 Mo. Quarantine On Township Dogs

The majority of Southfield township's civic organizations have voted to actively support a 90-day dog quarantine in the township area in an attempt to bring all dogs under control and protected from disease.

Representatives of Southfield schools, local government, and civic organizations met in the township hall Wednesday evening, Jan. 13 to map out a means to prevent further instances of a rabid animal touching off hysteria in their area.

Steps to reduce the number of stray dogs in the township as well as residents' dogs that are allowed to run freely were decided on after a rabid dog bit several youngsters in the southwest corner of Southfield in December.

The quarantine will continue from January 21 until April 21 and two clinics will be held within that time to enable residents to have their dogs vaccinated at a nominal cost.

SOUTHFIELD SCHOOL district officials told the group that information concerning the quarantine would be directed to parents through the schools and the Southfield Kiwanis and Optimist clubs offered to sponsor a poster contest to publicize the dog control campaign.

In the law enforcement side, the Southfield police department and dog warden promised an all-out effort to enforce the township's dog ordinance and promised stiff fines for repeated violations of the law.

A \$25 reward was offered by the Oakland County Humane Society for information leading to the conviction of a person seen dropping a dog off at the roadside.

Dr. Frank Condon, of the Oakland County Health Department explained the effects of the dreaded rabies disease and discussed treatments for its cure.

DR. T. M. BARR, Royal Oak

veterinarian, pledged the support of area veterinarians in helping with the vaccination program.

According to Dr. Barr, clinics for vaccination will be held at five stations two and three on February 12 and 14 and February 20 and 21. Station two is located on Nine Mile road west of Telegraph and station three is on Thirteen Mile west of Southfield. Dr. Barr stated he thought the fee for the service would be \$1.50.

Also pledging support to quarantine program were members of the Southfield PTA and Boy Scout troops.

On the same night Lathrup city councilmen made the dog ordinance their first law when they approved the rules governing dogs within the

city and set up license fees. Termed as emergency legislation, the ordinance will take immediate effect with Lathrup residents having until March 1 to purchase dog licenses at the city hall. The fee will be \$2 plus a 10 cent charge for the tag.

City councilmen also asked that their city be included in the dog quarantine.

THE HIGH SCHOOL girls rifle shooting activities under the leadership of George Ely have been discontinued but will be resumed as soon as the weather permits use of the outdoor police range.

Five lighted ice skating rinks at Booth park, Pembroke, Eton, St. James and Poppleton are operating without direct supervision. It is hoped that skaters will cooperate with recreation regulations by keeping sleds and hockey sticks off the ice during the daylight hours. Lights have been installed for these activities in the evenings. The Recreation Board does not sanction ice skating on Quanton Lake. As soon as adequate playground space is provided at Quanton school, a lighted rink will be constructed.
