Oakland county's Red Cross is currently building up a good backlog of trained "first aiders" with 10 courses already under way and a like number scheduled to start training shortly.

Among the future classes will be those at Barnum junior high school in Birmingham, directed by Frances Jeanne with another scheduled for the Southfield township section.

Men and women may enroll for these sessions at Red Cross offices in Pontiac or Royal Oak.

Boy Scout Leaders To Seek Members For Enrollment

Boy Scout leaders will meet tonight, Thursday, at Normandie Inn, Pleasant Ridge, for the kick-off of the 1954 sustaining-member enrollment in District One. This Boy Scout district covers all of Oakland County south of Pontiac and east of Inkster Road.

The purpose of the sustaining member enrollment is to secure funds to supplement those received from the United Foundation, and to train new leaders, so that an additional 2,000 boys can participate in Oakland County scouting.

The meeting will be held under the leadership of William G. Lerchen Jr., 950 Waddington, chairman of the enrollment and also vice-chairman of the district. The meeting will be attended by approximately 30 scouts, including eight community chairmen, William H. Breech, Birmingham, special gifts; E. Curtis Matthews, Bloomfield Hills, chairman for the south-eastern community; Robert E. Covert of Birmingham, chairman for the northern community.

JAMES D. EASTIN of Southfield, chairman for the Southfield community; Stuart Baker of Troy Township, chairman for the north-eastern community; Dr. Herman K. Meinke of Hazel Park, chairman for the Eastern Community; and Paul S. Seibold of Huntington Woods, chairman for the Western Community.

"There are thousands of boys of scout age in District One who would like to belong to Scouting, but are missing out on this opportunity because of lack of funds for more trained, professional leadership," Lerchen said. "Scouting has enjoyed an exceptional growth in District One due to the loyal support of the public in their giving through the North Drive and also the devoted efforts of hundreds of men and women who have provided leadership for the scouting program.

"This sustaining-member enrollment is directed to scout parents, and other friends and members of scouting, who would like to help us achieve our goal of 2,000 more in '54," Lerchen concluded.
