PEACH CREAM PIE

1-8" pastry shell 10 marshmallows
2 cups Stokely finest 1/2 cup nuts
sliced peaches 1/2 cup orange juice
1/2 cup powdered sugar 1/2 pint whipping cream
1/2 cup cherries

Cut marshmallows and add orange juice. Allow to stand while baking pastry shell. When shell is cool, fill with drained sliced peaches. Whip cream until stiff, add nuts, cherries and marshmallows. Pour over peaches. Place in refrigerator and allow to chill 4 hours. Top with additional whipped cream and sliced peaches. Cut in wedges and serve. Makes 6 servings.
