Good Records Ease Sentences

Their past good records stood two men in good stead Friday in Birmingham's Justice John J. Gaffill's court.

Sentence of \$10 fine and costs was suspended in the case of Wayne J. Ark, 29, of 90 Cutting, Troy township.

Ark had pleaded guilty to a charge of drunk and disorderly lines, but when Judge Gaffill learned that Ark had recently been discharged from the Army after 10 1/2 years of service, he suspended sentence.

However he ordered Ark to serve a six months non-drinking probation.

Theodore V. Myler, 5053 Commonwealth, Detroit, appeared before the Judge on a dual charge of drunk and reckless driving.

TESTIMONY showed that Myler has been driving for the same trucking company for 24 years without any previous arrests.

He was arrested on Dec. 23 on the drunk driving charge as he drove his truck south on Woodward.

Because of his record, Judge Gaffill allowed Myler to plead guilty to the lesser charge of reckless driving and fined him \$75.

I first got acquainted with the people in the Community House

employment office about a year and a half ago. I came to see if I could get me some kind of work so that I could go back to college. It isn't too easy for a handicapped person like myself to get a job. I've had cerebral palsy since I was born and I'm 23 years old now.

They were wonderful to me at the House. Mrs. Charlton, the employment office director, took an interest in my problem and got on the phone right away to see if I could get a job. It only took her about half an hour to locate one for me. She got me a job at Max Brook, Birmingham, and I've been working there ever since. I go to the University of Detroit in the daytime and do the janitor work at Brook's at night.

I couldn't finish my schooling if it weren't for this job and I want more than anything to finish college. It seems to me that a handicapped person has a much better chance in the world if they have a good education. I'd like to specialize in the field of political science but my main ambition is to help other handicapped people like myself.

I know that the employment office at the Community House gets jobs for many many people all the time. I know, too, that they help employers find workers. But I'm especially grateful to them for helping me the way they did.

'Freedom' Talk To Highlight Rotary Luncheon

A frontline fighter against what he calls "America's race toward European Statism," Frederick W. Overesch, advertising executive of Maxon, Inc., Detroit, will address Birmingham Rotarians at their luncheon next Monday on the subject, "Who Wants Freedom?"

With a background of 30 years in the art and advertising business, Overesch resigned his post as vice-president and director of Maxon's advertising agency in 1951 to devote full time to an effort to stop this "drift toward statism."

Overesch worked with the Small Business Economic Foundation of Chicago to produce 104 full-page newspaper educational ads, designed to show how American liberty has resulted in the greatest economic progress in history.

These ads also pointed to encroachment by our government against the basic principles of liberty, and urged a moral posture for government as a means of regaining "our lost liberties." They were sponsored by over 7,000 small business men in 50 cities and reached an estimated 13 million readers.

Overesch also has written many newspaper articles on the theme of clean politics and individual liberties that have been published both locally and nationally.

At present he is back with Maxon's as creative head of a food dealer's account.

Overesch will be introduced at the luncheon by Marshall Fredericks, noted Birmingham sculptor. The two men have been acquainted for many years.

Plan Two Shows At Art Museum

Photography and printmaking will be featured in two exhibitions opening Friday, Jan. 29, at the Museum of Cranbrook Academy of Art, according to an announcement by Eva I. Gating, museum director.

On view until February 18, the Michigan Printmakers Society Show will display the work of outstanding state artists in lithography, etching and wood-cut.

"Leading Photographers," an exhibit circulated by the Museum of Modern Art, New York, features the work of Alfred Stieglitz, Man Ray and Ansel Adams, and will continue through February 21.

Alfred Stieglitz, one of the earliest champions of photography as an art, was internationally famous before his death in 1946. Besides pioneering in photographic technique, he was among the first to found camera clubs and photography publications for both amateurs and professionals.

There will be fifteen prints, including portraits and rayograms, by Man Ray, who started his art career as a post-impressionist and cubist painter. His camera experimentation is considered to be the basis of many current trends among art and commercial photographers.

After training for a career as a concert pianist, Ansel Adams has, since 1927, devoted full time to taking pictures, and writing and lecturing about photography. He is a teacher at the University of California.
