## Cranbrook Guild Presents 'Voice of Minstrelsy' Show

Poet, composer, singer and instrumentalist is 30-year-old Richard Dyer-Bennet, 20th century minstrel who accompanies himself on the Spanish guitar.

One thing that sets him apart from other folk singers is the range of his repertoire. Knowing foreign languages, he does not rely exclusively on the songs of America and the British Isles, and having a scholarly mind he finds out-of-the-way songs.

Dyer-Bennet will be presented by the Cranbrook Music Guild in "The Voice of Minstrelsy," a program of the world's great traditional songs. The concert will begin at 8:30 p.m., Wednesday, Feb. 3, at Cranbrook School auditorium, Bloomfield Hills.

Born in England, Dyer-Bennet was brought up in California and educated at the University of California. Gertrude Wheeler, San Francisco voice teacher, heard him at a Christmas party and urged him to journey to Sweden to hear the great minstrel of the last generation, Sven Scholander.

Eleven years ago he set out for Sweden to hear and talk to Scholander. With the hundred selections in German, Swedish and French that the aged master gave him, he returned to California to begin his career in minstrelsy.

Now making his 9th American concert tour, he made his debut in New York Town Hall and has appeared there 20 times since. He also performed at Carnegie Hall, but this is his first performance in the Detroit area.

## 'Happy Days' Cast In Final Rehearsals

Scenes for "Happy Days," first public production by the Teen-Age Theater Workshop, will have stage settings designed by Louis Gonet, ceramics student at Cranbrook.

Gonet, a native of Switzerland, moved to France as a child and spent most of his life there, coming to this country in 1941. He studied at the art institute in Florence, Italy and in the Atelier Savoy in Paris, and associated with Cranbrook since his arrival in the States.

The set is being built on his plans, with the help of Richard Trussell of the Harry Denyes architectural firm.

"Happy Days" is being produced under the sponsorship of the Birmingham Civic Club, and will have two performances at the Community House on Feb. 6. The audience will be given at 8:30 p.m., with an evening show at 8:30. Mrs. Eliot Robinson is assisting in being done."
