Nancy was one of two children from the United States selected from 150 auditions to attend the famed school. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Carnegie.

**Lathrup Dancer To Study At Sadler's Welles School**

Seven years of diligent study and training have earned for an 11-year-old Lathrup girl the chance to study at the internationally famed Sadler's Welles School of Ballet in London, England.

Nancy Carnegie, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Carnegie, 15006 Greenwood, and a sixth grade student at the Annie Lathrup school, was one of two United States children selected for the school after successfully auditioning before Albee Phillips, principal of the school, last week at the Civic Opera company in Chicago, Ill.

Nancy will leave for England in September, returning to her home for seven weeks next summer, and then back again to the London school to resume her studies that may be extended for several years.

THE YOUNG girl was discovered by Valerie Taylor, a member of the Sadler's Welles troupe now touring the United States and due to return to England in three weeks to open a new show there.

Nancy, with her parents and her 14-year-old brother, Bill, went to Chicago for her audition Wednesday, Dec. 30, and learned after her performance that she was accepted for the school.

Nancy began dancing at the age of four when she started acrobatic work. Later she became an accomplished tap dancer and added ballet to her achievements. She has also been a member of the Will-O-Way dramatics group.

Acceptance to the school will mean an end for two of her favorite hobbies: horseback riding and swimming.

Patricia Watson of Dearborn and Carol Serenber of Lathrup have been Nancy's ballet instructors.

**AAUW To Hear 'Far East' Talk By Professor**

Members and guests of the Birmingham Branch of the American Association of University Women will hear Dr. James D. van Putten at 12:45 p.m., Jan. 13, at the Birmingham Community House.

Speaking on "New Views of Old Lands", the visiting professor of political science and history at Hope college will project some new ideas concerning the Far East.

Guest speaker for the organization's International Relations program has a wealth of practical experience in the Orient, having taught at Hanchow college, Hanchow, China, during the twenties.

He later acted as director of the United States Information Service for the State department in Peiping, China from 1947 through 1950. From 1928 to 1932 he was headmaster and treasurer of the Kodaikanal school in India and was investigator for the King of Siam on opium and rice problems in 1931.

Dr. van Putten served with the U. S. Navy from 1942 to 1946. He was a member of Admiral Halsey's staff in the South Pacific in Intelligence, serving later on the planning staff for Pacific invasions in Hawaii. He was head of the Education department for the military government in Guam from 1944 to 1945 and was a Judge on the supreme court of Guam in 1945-46.

FROM MAY 1950 to June 1951, Dr. van Putten was acting director of U. S. Information Service in the Republic of South Africa and in the same post a year later in Formosa.

He received his bachelor's and master's degrees from Hope college and his Ph.D. at the University of Chicago. Mrs. Charles D. Shain, who conducts the International Relations class sponsored by the AAUW, will introduce Dr. van Putten.
