## Music Guild Presents The Michigan Singers

Members of the Cranbrook Music guild, guests, and the interested public will hear The Michigan Singers at a Jan. 10 concert at 4 p.m. at Cranbrook auditorium.



PROF. M. J. KLEIN

Prof. Maynard J. Klein, associate director of choral music and director of university choirs at the University of Michigan, will conduct the chorus of 70 highly trained voices in a program rich in the music of the 15th, 16th, and 17th centuries.

The singers will be supported by soloists from the University School of Music, including Joan Marie Dudd, soprano; Mary Matfield and Mary Ellen Boosa, contraltos and Charles Wingert, tenor. There will be two accompanists, William Dappman and Mary Catherine Hutkins.

IN THE program, Prof. Klein has included such famous names in the annals of musical literature as Josquin Dupre, the 15th century Flemish composer, Orlando Lassus, Thomas Morley, of Madrigal fame, and the great Palestrina whose "Missa Papae Marcelli" (written in 1565 and reputed to be one of the most celebrated pieces of musical composition).

Also included are the two Rus-

sian composers Rachmaninoff and Gretchaninoff. Detroiters have long felt a sense of pride in the fact that Gretchaninoff lived and worked in their midst for several years. His musical setting to "The Lord's Prayer" is perhaps the best known here.

THE CONCERT will close with two numbers that are considered to make the most exciting demands upon a choral group—Anton Bruckner's Mass in E Minor and the world renowned "Magnificat" by J. S. Bach.

The ticket table will be staffed by Guild treasurer Wayne A. Andrews, Mrs. Parsons Nel and assistant secretary Mrs. Floyd W. Bunt. Henry S. Booth will handle details for decorating. Stage management is in the hands of Gerard S. Blythe. Ticket takers are Morley Walker, James Schneider and Mark Harper.

The Michigan Singers will be heard in concert at Hill Auditorium, Ann Arbor, Jan. 8, prior to their Bloomfield Hills engagement.

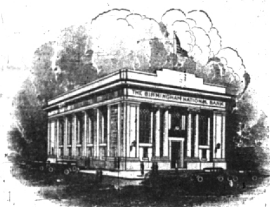
