Family Favorites

Special Fruit Salad Dressing

Mrs. J. J. Roura, Jr. 227 Euclid, has a recipe for an unusual fruit salad dressing. Fruit salads are always good, any time of the year, but sometimes the dressing will make them taste even better.

This recipe came from the household of Edna Guest, the Detroit Free Press poet. It is the same as the one which the Women's City Club in Detroit has served with pride for years.

Here it is for those who want to try it.

FRUIT SALAD DRESSING

2/3 cup sugar	1 teaspoon grated onion
1 teaspoon dry mustard	5 tablespoons vinegar
1 teaspoon paprika	1 tablespoon lemon juice
3/4 teaspoon salt	1/3 cup strained honey
1 or 2 teaspoons celery seed,	1 cup salad oil
as desired	

Mix dry ingredients, add honey, vinegar, lemon juice and grated onion. Pour oil into mixture very slowly, beating constantly. Makes two cups of dressing.

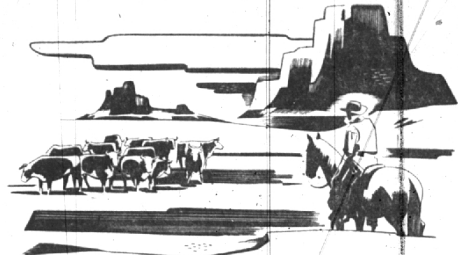
