## First Place Ties Feature LL Play

The front running Indians stumbled last week against the Yankees and, when they regained their balance, found themselves face-to-face with the Tigers in a showdown game for the American Little League's first half championship.

In the closely-matched National League, the Braves and Giants were deadlocked as the final first half game loomed.

The Braves staged two rallies for victories, one a 6-4 defeat of the Giants with whom they ended the week tied for first. Gary Mow gained his third victory of the season in beating the Giants. Each team had only one first half game remaining.

Bill Muenchinger, star Yankee pitcher, shut out the Indians 4-0. His mates got him four runs in the first three innings as they routed Larry Stuber, starting Indian hurler.

THE DEFEAT awakened the Indians who came back to crush the Red Sox 17-1 two days later. Bob Appel, stocky Indian outfielder, hit a grand slam homer during the rout.

The Tigers took advantage of their rival's slip by winning two games to bring themselves up even with the Indians. This made Monday night's Indian-Tiger game a decisive one.

Phil Isbell, Tiger hurler who has been so effective this year that he has allowed a total of only two hits in four complete games, blanked the Yankees 5-0 in a one-hitter. He was available to face the Indians.

The Tigers, getting their runs in batches of three, also beat the Red Sox 9-5.

Isbell and Bob Hawkins, Red Sox catcher, continued their home run hitting, each putting his fourth blast of the season over the fence.

THE CUBS, who started the first half at a fast pace, lost two games, but won the Pirates drawing them 8-1 and the Braves adding

another defeat, 8-0.

Hard hitting by the Giants in the early innings gave them a 7-4 win over the Pirates.

The two leagues changed fields Wednesday for the second half. Tonight's (Thursday) game between the Giants and Pirates, like all future National League games, will be at Eton Field, at the east end of Lincoln American League field, including tonight's Tiger-Yankee clash, will be at St. James Field, behind the YMCA on Lincoln.
