Police said the boy, Edward L. Dingley III, son of Mr. and Mrs. Edward L. Dingley, Jr., 907 Ann, was riding his bike on the sidewalk when he was struck by a car driven by Mrs. Muriel L. Stevens, 1126 W. 11 Mile, Royal Oak, as she turned into the driveway of the hospital where she is employed. Edward was treated for a bruised leg by the Dingley's family doctor.

Lathrup's First Special Assessment Set for Hearing

Lathrup Village city councilmen at a special Monday night meeting accepted petitions for the block-topping of Lathrup from Twelve Mile to Goldengate and East California from Goldengate to Sunset. They set July 12 as the date for a public hearing on the improvements, the first projects in the city under the new special assessment ordinance.

A revised fee schedule for the city's violations bureau was referred to City Attorney William Ewart and Municipal Judge Leonard V. Pykas for study and recommendation.

Councilmen learned that the city's wholesale water contract with the City of Detroit had been approved by the Detroit water board and was waiting signature of Mayor Albert Cobo, possibly later this week.

They set Tuesday, July 6, as the next regular meeting of the council.

Sarver will judge the first show. Ribbons will be awarded at the final show on an accumulated point basis. Animals must be cared for by owners, without professional help.

Classes will be held on condition, English horsemanship, Tennessee walking horse, hunter hack, western horsemanship and other divisions according to adult horse show rules.
