The Strandlugs tubs weigh about one-fourth as much as enameled steel models, is chip-resistant and responds quickly to body and water temperatures. Its light weight also cuts freight costs, and reduces the purchase price of the tub. Demand for the tubs by the trailer industry and improved manufacturing methods have brought production to a scale where expanded distribution will be possible in the near future, according to Strand.

Davey Crockett Leads A Barren Existence

David Crockett, a budding ornithologist and former Birmingham boy, has a most unusual and exciting summer job for a 17-year-old. As a member of a scientific expedition, he is exploring the tundra of the far northern Canadian wilds.

David, the son of Mr. and Mrs. C. V. Crockett, lived with his family on Kennesaw in Birmingham until three years ago, when the family moved to Ray Village, Ohio, a suburb of Cleveland.

Last month David left from the Cleveland airport for Churchill, Manitoba, to join the Dr. Herbert W. Brandt expedition and from there traveled to the Barrens, the land beyond the timber line in the Arctic.

In this place, far from outside contacts, he will remain with the expedition for one month, until a plane arrives to bring the group back to civilization sometime near the end of July.

David's project for Dr. Brandt, the renowned birdlife expert and author, is the study of the yellow rail, black polled warbler and the solitary sandpiper.

While the locale is different, bird watching is nothing new to David, for he has been doing it for years.

Under the leadership of Scoutmaster Harold De Orlow of Troop B-4, Adams school, David's interest in nature and the outdoors was stimulated.

HE REGULARLY attended the annual bird walks at Cranbrook Institute of Science each spring and became good friends with Walter Nichols, the Institute's naturalist. To these two men, David credits his interest in ornithology and the outdoors.

An active member of the Lake Erie Junior Museum, David carried the museum's expedition flag on his journey to the Barrens, and was commissioned to bring back moths, butterflies and artifacts from the barren land.

Now a senior at Bay Village high school, David has continued in scouting. He is senior crew leader of the Bay Village Troop 2195 and is junior assistant scoutmaster of Bay Village Troop 2195. He has earned the Silver Award, top award in Explorer Scouts.

A paper drive will be conducted by patrol of the troop in their immediate neighborhoods on July 30.

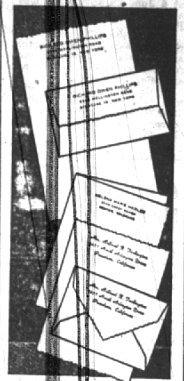
Elm St. Vacation Tabled Temporarily
