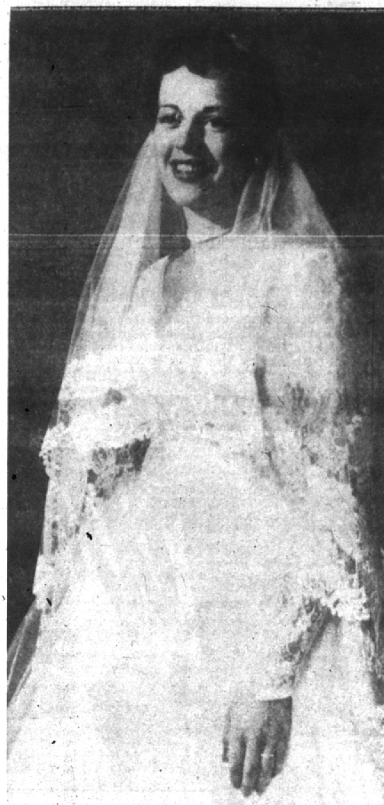
Joseph Korth, cousin of the groom, was best man. Ushering were Donald Korth of Royal Oak, Jack Manville and Richard Ball of Berkeley.
