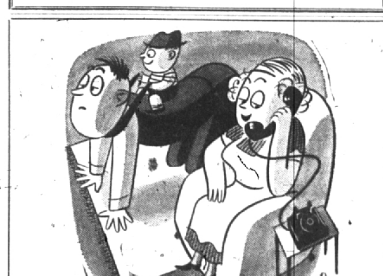

### Winners Named In Troy's Summer Recreation Play

Two annual tournaments have been concluded in the Troy summer recreation program.

The marbles championship and ping pong championships were decided on the Big Beaver playground. Freddie Rendell won the marbles title, and Shirley Keidel won the ping pong tournament. Fredie Rendell was awarded the blue ribbon for the marbles contest.

It was Vern Bauer who walked off with the most marbles and the first place badge. Billy Richardson was runner up in marbles and John Smith placed third.

Although there were no girls entered in the marbles tournament the girls are holding their own in the program. Linda Lawrence, a left handed third baseman, has the distinction of being the only girl in the 11 year-old baseball league. She beat out several boys for the position of third base on the Troy No. 2 team.

The horse-draw tournament was held on the Big Beaver playground, July 2, as well as the bike day program starting this best decorated bike. There were races, obstacle courses, and trick riding. Prizes and ribbons were given out for this event.

Reaffirming Birmingham's existing business zoning as set up by the preliminary 1970 land use plan, City Planning Director Robert Boatman told members of the South Oakland Planning council at a meeting July 7 that the city's commercial zoning extends east to Adams, extending from the residential island comprising the area bounded by Forest, Adams, Elm and Bowers.

This is contrary to Detroit's Metropolitan Area Regional Planning commission, whose master plan shows the city's business zoning stopping at Hunter, instead of extending to Adams, Boatman said.

The city plan board's primary concern is to protect the residential characteristics of the zoned area—east of Elm, north of Bowers, west of Adams and south of lots facing Forest.

THE THREAT that business may break into that area already has been made and one meeting to prevent this already has been held. The next meeting is scheduled for July 27, Boatman added.

Boatman said the city is 85 per cent developed, residentially and 50 per cent commercially. Assessed valuation jumped to \$48,807,200 in 1954. It was \$20,004,020 in 1950.

The city's population stands at about 22,500 now compared to about 15,000 in 1950, he said.

The Forritt property development is the only large production building underway, according to Boatman.
