

# Little Leagues Here Name Players for Tournament

Birmingham's two Little Leagues will send their all star teams into tournament play this week end. They may face each other for the first time Saturday, July 17.

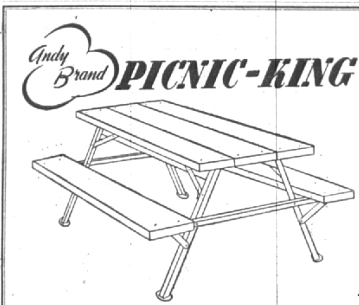
The American Leaguers will take on Farmington, an old rival, at St. James Field at 5:30 p.m. Friday.

The same National League team which drew a bye in the first round, will face the winner on the same diamond at 2 p.m. Saturday.

The survivor will go to Grosse Pointe the following Friday evening, July 23, to play the winner of a playoff there between teams from Grosse Pointe and Livonia. Final arrangements for the area finals will be worked out this week as state and national headquarters differ on the methods to be used in determining pairings.

The Detroit metropolitan champion will be crowned after a fourth round contest in Grosse Pointe Saturday afternoon July 24, between the victor in this section and the team emerging from playoffs in Hamtramck and Lincoln Park.

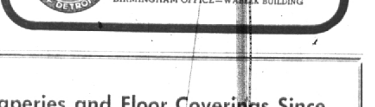
In the July issue of Little Leagueur, the official publication of the national league program, the Birmingham league is lauded for its attempts to keep financing of play on a community basis.
