

Localites Vacation At Lake Michigan

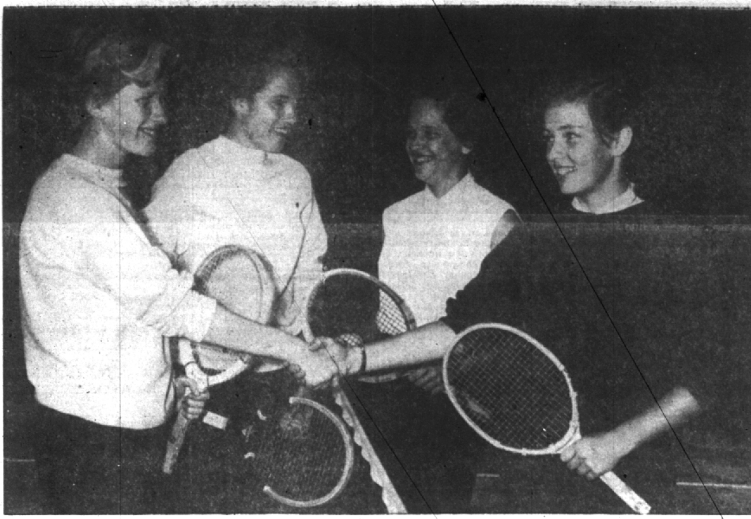
July 8 officially opened the season at the Old Trail Inn at Harbor Springs and many localites already are enjoying vacations there on the shore of Lake Michigan.

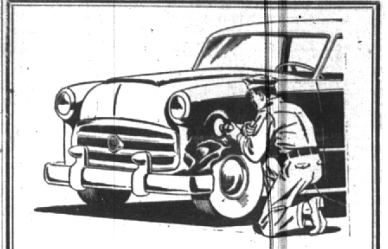
