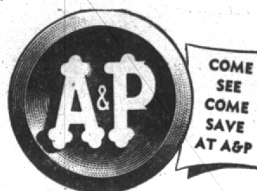
They concluded their Troop activities with a potluck picnic at the home of their leader at which time Judy Mansfield was awarded her year pin.

The Birmingham YMCA is accepting reservations for its August portion of the DAY program, Aug. 9-27.

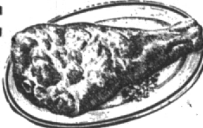
