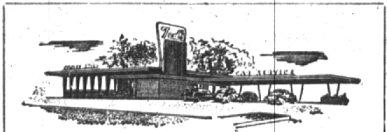

Etton Park to Get \$11,000 Worth Of Improvements

Further development of Etton Park is being studied by the Birmingham recreation board following City Manager D. C. Egbert's announcement last week that the city has about \$11,000 to spend for park improvement this year. Egbert told the board at its meeting Thursday that he would like the board to make recommendations as to how the money could best be used. Members agreed Etton Park should get top priority. IN ITS first discussions the board indicated a building with rest room and storage facilities should be built first for Etton park; landscaping and a new softball field should get secondary consideration.

Possible costs of such improvements will be studied at future meetings of the board. In other action, the board approved a revised budget for the 1954-55 fiscal year calling for a cut from the tentative budget of \$45,100 to \$14,290. The city's share will be \$11,500 with other revenues supplying the balance.
