## JULY JUNKET

It is time to ramble through the yard and do a few things in order to reap the full harvest of all the money you have spent and the energy you have expended.

Now, with a little more of each, you can—

1. Get rid of ants with CHLORDANE (Dust or liquid—indoors or out.)
2. Water the ROCK GARDEN as regularly as you do the regular garden.
3. Don't be a host to SUCKERS around lilacs, almonds, Jap. cherry, etc. Cut off every sucker below the graft.
4. RAISE—RAISE—RAISE the lawn mower to 2 inches if possible.
5. SPREAD — SPREAD — SPREAD some lawn food right away. GRO-SOD, XXX or REGAL.
6. Broad-leaved weeds succumb readily to the overpowering killing effect of DIMETHYLAMINE 2, 4 DICHLOROPHENOXYACETATE applied with an adequate dispenser. (2-4D with a good sprayer or spreader.)
7. CRABGRASS—We can't go into this again but suggest that you discuss your problem with us so that a proper material for the equipment you own can be recommended.
8. One shot of ROTENONE spray will take care of the asparagus beetle. He is a pretty beetle and will be found on the asparagus foliage.
9. When juniper and spruce trees turn rusty—oil them with VOLCK'S OIL SPRAY—after turning the full hose stream on them (what we are going after here is an 8 legged mite called RED SPIDER).
10. Keep after phlox mildew by keeping roots moist and dusting with SULPHUR.
11. Spray stems of squash plants with BLACK LEAF 40 near ground to help control borers which are hard to handle on older plants.
12. It is now too late to plant turnips—thank heaven!

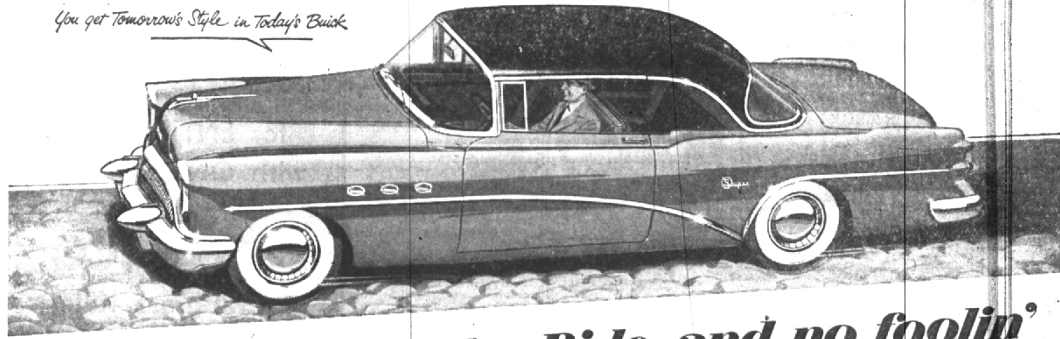

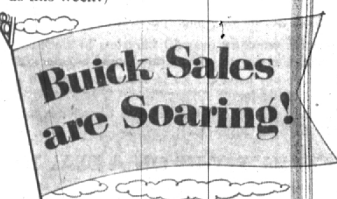
