

Isbell's Big Bat Leads LL Tigers To 12-2 Victory

Phil Isbell, a tall, good-natured 12-year-old who alternated between pitching and playing first base for the Tigers, stole the Little League spotlight last week by hitting four home runs in as many times at bat against the Red Sox.

All of the balls went over the fence.

If it had been necessary for him to bat in the sixth, he might have made it five. As it was, Isbell drove in nine runs in the Tigers' 12-2 victory that left them alone in first place.

The four clubs gave him 10 home runs for the season.

The Indians, who had been tied with the Tigers, were beaten 17-2 by the Yankees and dropped into second place. Bill Muenchinger, Yankee shortstop, got two home runs and two singles to lead his team to their first second-half victory. The game was tied 3 to 3 until the Yankees staged a nine-run rally in the sixth. They got 5 more in the sixth.

THE YANKEES had a 4-0 lead on the Tigers in their game but finally lost out 7-4.

With Al Forker pitching, the Indians beat the Red Sox 8 to 2 as the latter got only two hits.

Isbell and Muenchinger were not used as pitchers last week so that they might be available for tournament duties. Forker and Jay Madonna, Red Sox pitcher, will also be saved from regular play mound work as long as the league all stars remain in the running for the state championship.

There were only three games in the National League, the Braves-Giants game being postponed so that George Didier might pitch against Lincoln Park South in tournament play Friday night.

The Pirates won twice to remain on top. Rogor Barrett and Bruce Withers combined to shut out the Giants 7-0 on two hits and then two nights later the Pirates defeated the Cubs 9-4.

The Braves also beat the Cubs 7-4 as Steve Jacobson and Larry Kelly hit home runs. The victory kept the Braves first half winners, only one game behind the Pirates.
